- 5. Together met, together bound, by all that God has done, we'll go with joy, to give the world, the love that makes us one.




Thanksgiving

Bible Reading – Matthew 18:15-20, When Someone Sins, Good News Translation (GNT).

¹⁵ "If your brother sins against you, go to him and show him his fault. But do it privately, just between yourselves. If he listens to you, you have won your brother back. ¹⁶ But if he will not listen to you, take one or two other persons with you, so that 'every accusation may be upheld by the testimony of two or more witnesses,' as the scripture says. ¹⁷ And if he will not listen to them, then tell the whole thing to the church. Finally, if he will not listen to the church, treat him as though he were a pagan or a tax collector.

¹⁸ "And so I tell all of you: what you prohibit on earth will be prohibited in heaven, and what you permit on earth will be permitted in heaven.

¹⁹ "And I tell you more: whenever two of you on earth agree about anything you pray for, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven. ²⁰ For where two or three come together in my name, I am there with them."

Introducing the Theme & Learning Spaces Not being able to break out into our learning spaces, here are a few thoughts about the theme for today prepared by Brenda. For young people you can use the Children's and Youth sheets that are being sent out separately.

The church community is a family in which we are brothers and sisters and sometimes things happen that harm relationships within the church family. When Matthew wrote his gospel the Early Church already consisted of groups meeting together. Matthew is recording Jesus' teaching about what to do when things go wrong. Jesus is at the heart of the Kingdom of God. We are all equal and how we live matters.

Jewish tradition had already covered this difficult situation in the Old Testament book of Leviticus which says four things: the sinner should be reproved; anger is dangerous; guilt is contagious; the motivation should be love. Jesus develops the ideas into a more realistic three-fold pattern for resolution: person-to-person, before two or three witnesses and finally before the Church as a whole.

Something is missing from this passage which has been cut short by the lectionary reading....where is forgiveness in all of this? Jesus' teaching on the issue of forgiveness will have to wait until the gospel reading for next week!
