


Thanksgiving

Our reading from St Paul's letter to the Philippians speaks of the gift of that special feeling of peace that comes from God: have you an experience of peace that you wish to share? A time, a moment, a peaceful space within your busy life? Take a moment to say thank you now.

Opening Prayer: If you are able, and it is safe to do so, light a candle at this point

Lord, we light this candle, to remind us that you are the light of the world. As we gather together in spirit, make our voices ready to sing your praise; our hearts open to receive your love and our minds alive to your Spirit. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.



We seek God's healing and forgiveness

We come to God as one from whom no secrets are hidden, to ask for his forgiveness and peace.

When we have failed to recognise your love in the actions of friend or stranger, **Father, forgive.**

When we have failed to recognise your presence in the world in which we live, **Father, forgive.**

When we have failed to remember your gospel in our actions, thoughts and words, **Father, forgive.** (pause)

Lord God, renew our hearts in worship, our minds in wisdom, and our hands in service as a sacrifice of love. Take our lives and use them, that we may work in unity with others, always praying and pursuing all that is honourable, pure and praiseworthy for Jesus sake, **Amen**.

We hear words assuring us of God's forgiveness

May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

Bible Reading: Philippians 4:1-9 NRSV

- ¹Therefore, my brothers and sisters,* whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord in this way, my beloved.
- ² I urge Euodia and I urge Syntyche to be of the same mind in the Lord. ³Yes, and I ask you also, my loyal companion, help these women, for they have struggled beside me in the work of the gospel, together with Clement and the rest of my co-workers, whose names are in the book of life.
- ⁴ Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. ⁵Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. ⁶Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.
- ⁸ Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honourable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things.
- ⁹Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you.

Introducing the Theme & Learning Spaces Not being able to break out into our learning spaces, here are a few thoughts about the theme for today prepared by Linda. For young people you can use the Children's sheet that is being sent out separately.

Paul has been encouraging the Christian in Philippi to live as citizens of heaven on earth, then when Jesus returns, he will transform their bodies for life in glory. However, he especially urges two women, Euodia and Syntyche, who have been squabbling, to end their quarrel. Although both have worked with Paul for the sake of the Gospel, they have fallen out badly with each other. Paul has already taught that unity is already vital to the health of the church, so now he asks these two to 'agree with each other in the Lord'. He also asks one of his trusted colleagues to help them.

Paul also urges the Philippians to rejoice in the Lord. This joy doesn't depend on good circumstances or happy feelings. It is the deep satisfaction that comes from belonging to Christ and being united in love and purpose. The Philippians are to be gentle, confident and prayerful, as is fitting for people who live together as the Lord's friends and await his coming. If they are anxious about anything, they must turn it to prayer, with thanksgiving. Then God will protect their hearts and minds with peace – the amazing peace when the love of Christ conquers and embraces all.

Finally, Paul encourages the Philippians to fill their minds with good and beautiful ideals. This will purify their imagination and inspire their actions. Paul tell them to live out the gospel in practical ways. He offer his own life as a model of Christian living. This is not pride as much as good discipling. Paul is a teacher who is willing for his own life to be scrutinised by his pupils to see how he practises what he preaches.

What might we need to do to ensure there is more harmony and unity in our lives and how will this help us become better Christians?

Handing over our worries and anxieties to God in prayer should also include thanksgiving. Do we always remember to do this?

Do we always practice what we preach? Who do we look to as an example?

All Age Creative – Activity idea:

In our Bible story for today we have heard of Paul's wish that the people will support each other in prayer and in sharing the good news about Jesus, that they will look after each other and help those who have worries will know Christ's peace and feel comforted.



Find a clean empty jar [or other suitable container], have pieces of paper and a pencil/pen/marker

Decorate the jar then write onto some of the pieces of paper your own worries, or worries that are bothering people you know, and drop into the jar/container.

Each day hold the jar and ask God to send His peace into the hearts and minds of those who are anxious. You can also add new worries as they come along.

If a worry is solved take out the paper, give thanks to God, and throw that prayer away!
