A reading from Colossians 3

{read by Enid Plowman}

Christ is all, and is in all. Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience.

Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity. Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace. And be thankful.

Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom through psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit, singing to God with gratitude in your hearts.

And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God.

St Paul's letter applies as much to us today as it did to the early Christians over 2000 years ago: the call to put to good use all the gifts and attributes that are blessings from God – to centre our lives on seeking, and striving, for unity and peace giving thanks to God for Jesus, who set us the example of how to dwell together and serve each other.

We cry out for peace yet what part can we play in sharing Christ's message in action, word and deed?

From great sacrifices as in war, to the silent prayer for the neighbour in need, all are in their own way responses to the call to:

Let the peace of Christ rule in our hearts, since as members of one body we are called to strive for peace.

And whatever we do, whether in word or deed, to always do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, never forgetting to give thanks to God for the opportunities to be channels of His peace that passes all understanding.
