

We seek God's healing and forgiveness:

We come to God as one from whom no secrets are hidden, to ask for his forgiveness and peace.

God of the journey, when we hear you calling us to change, but we resist you: **heal us and help us.**

Jesus, when you call us to prepare for something new, but we prefer old habits: **heal us and help us.**

Sprit, when you stir us up to face new challenges, but we close our eyes to the needs of others... heal us and help us.

Holy God, call us to live more deeply in you. **Amen.**

Bible Reading Mark 1.1-8 The Proclamation of John the Baptist – Good News Translation

- ¹ This is the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. ² It began as the prophet Isaiah had written:
- "God said, 'I will send my messenger ahead of you to open the way for you.'
- ³ Someone is shouting in the desert, 'Get the road ready for the Lord; make a straight path for him to travel!""
- ⁴ So John appeared in the desert, baptizing and preaching. "Turn away from your sins and be baptized," he told the people, "and God will forgive your sins." 5 Many people from the province of Judea and the city of Jerusalem went out to hear John. They confessed their sins, and he baptized them in the Jordan River.
- ⁶ John wore clothes made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. ⁷ He announced to the people, "The man who will come after me is much greater than I am. I am not good enough even to bend down and untie his sandals. 8 I baptize you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."
